Start your sightseeing tour at 8:00 Am from your hotel. Bagan is an ancient city with nearly 4400 temples. Upon arrival, we will drive to the colorful and **the bustling Nyaung Oo local market** that gives you a glimpse of the local life as well as the numerous tourist-oriented wares on offer, ranging from t-shirts and woodcarvings to lacquer ware and paintings. The tour extended to **the Shwezigon pagoda**, one of the four most significant buildings in Bagan. Continue to visit **the Htilominlo pagoda**, famed for its original fine plaster carvings and glazed sandstone decorations which are remarkably well preserved before the visit to **the Ananda Pagoda**, one of the finest, largest and best persevered in Old Bagan. During your visit in Bagan, you will also have a chance to see a **lacquer ware workshop** whose birthplace is in Bagan. Finally, visit the **Dhammayangyi Pagoda**, Bagan's largest temple. Enjoy sunset from one of the most scenic spots in town and return to the hotel. Transfer back to your hotel.
